

## **Key AFSCME Roll Calls (2015-2016)**

### **HB 200, Senate Floor Amendment #1 – Defunding Local Government Services**

HB 200, SFA#1 contains language proposed in Bruce Rauner's Turnaround Agenda that would devastate local government services by cutting funds for the Local Government Distributive Fund by 50%.

HB 200, SFA#1 failed to get the required votes necessary for adoption.

*A No vote is considered a right vote. A Yes vote, Present vote, or not voting vote is considered a wrong vote.*

### **HB 574 –Privatization of Economic Development Services**

This legislation puts the State's economic development programs under the control of a newly created corporate entity controlled by political appointees. Similar experiments in other states have shown that these types of public-private-partnerships lack adequate oversight, fail to produce results, lead to scandal, and increase the dominance of big corporations with political connections.

HB 574 passed the House and remains in the Senate Committee on Assignments.

*A No vote is considered a right vote. A Yes vote, Present vote, or not voting is considered a wrong vote.*

### **HB 580 – Fair Arbitration for State Employees Who Work Under the Governor**

This legislation extended to all state workers the same fair arbitration process provided for state troopers, most state corrections employees, municipal police and fire personnel as an avenue to a contract settlement free of the disruptions and hardships brought on by a work stoppage.

HB 580 passed the General Assembly and was vetoed by the Governor. HB 580 failed to receive the required votes to override the Governor's veto in the House.

### **HB 697, House Floor Amendment #2 - Union Busting**

HB 697, HFA#2 contains Bruce Rauner's proposal to gut collective bargaining rights for local government and school district employees by prohibiting bargaining over core issues such as wages, health care, privatization of services, and job rights. HFA#2 also eliminates provisions requiring that units of local government pay prevailing wage rates.

HB 697, HFA#2 failed to get the required votes necessary for adoption.

**HB 4326 – Reopening of Hardin County Work Camp**

This legislation would require the Illinois Department of Corrections to operate the Hardin County work camp located in Cave-In-Rock, Illinois. HB 4326 became necessary after Governor Rauner closed the work camp in 2015 despite objections raised by AFSCME and the Commission on Government Forecasting and Accountability.

HB 4326 passed the General Assembly and was vetoed by the Governor. HB 4326 will be returned to the House of Representatives for further action in the November Veto Session.

*A Yes vote is considered a right vote. A No, Present, or not voting is considered a wrong vote.*

**HB 5104 – Halt Expansion of Privatization of Medical Services in the Department of Corrections**

HB 5104 restricts the Illinois Departments of Corrections and Juvenile Justices' ability to replace 322 state employees who currently provide medical and mental health services by bringing in private vendors to perform the work.

HB 5104 passed the General Assembly and is awaiting action by the governor.

*A Yes vote is considered a right vote. A No, Present, or not voting is considered a wrong vote.*

**HB 5931 – Living Wage for Direct Support Personnel**

This legislation would require the Department of Human Services to establish a reimbursement rate for services provided to people with intellectual and developmental disabilities that would support a base wage of not less than \$15/hour for direct support personnel. Direct support personnel have not received a wage increase in over 8 years.

HB 5931 passed the General Assembly and is awaiting action by the governor.

*A Yes vote is considered a right vote. A No, Present, or not voting is considered a wrong vote.*

**HB 6162 – Protection for Working Caregivers**

HB 6162 requires employers to allow employees to use up to six months of earned sick leave benefits for caregiving responsibilities, rather than restricting them to using that leave for their own health-related issues.

HB 6162 passed the General Assembly and was signed into law.

*A Yes vote is considered a right vote. A No, Present, or not voting is considered a wrong vote.*

**HB 1286, House Floor Amendment #2 – Right to Work for Less Zones**

As part of Bruce Rauner's Turnaround Agenda to weaken worker rights, this legislation allows local governments to prohibit fair share fees by creating local "Right-to-Work" zones. Fair share fees are paid by non-members in a bargaining unit and cover the cost of negotiating and enforcing the union contracts from which everyone benefits. It is well documented that states with so called "right-to-work" laws experience lower wages, high poverty, lesser quality schools and higher child mortality rates.

HB 1286, HFA#2 failed to get the required votes necessary for adoption.

*A No vote is considered a right vote. A Yes vote, Present vote, or not voting is considered a wrong vote.*

**HB 1380 – Timely Enforcement of Arbitration Awards**

A party to a collective bargaining agreement who refuses to arbitrate a dispute or to comply with an arbitration award, or who appeals an arbitration award to court, shall pay all reasonable costs of the proceedings in the reviewing courts, including the other party's attorneys' fees, unless they are successful in overturning the award.

HB 1380 passed the General Assembly and was vetoed by the Governor. HB 1380 will be returned to the House of Representatives for action in the November Veto Session

*A Yes vote is considered a right vote. A No, Present, or not voting is considered a wrong vote.*

**HB 3763/SB 2038 - Payment of Back Wages**

These bills, at the time of passage by their chamber of origin, provided for the payment of the remaining withheld negotiated pay wages for state employees in some 16 state agencies but primarily in the Departments of Corrections, Human Services, Juvenile Justice, Natural Resources, and Public Health.

HB 3763 passed the House but was amended in the Senate to become the FY2016 Education Budget.

SB 2038 passed the Senate but was amended in the House to become a vehicle bill.

*A Yes vote is considered a right vote. A No, Present, or not voting is considered a wrong vote.*

**HB 6299 – Recall Rights for Educational Paraprofessionals**

This bill establishes recall rights for educational support personnel. If an employee is removed or dismissed as a result of a school board decision, then is called back within one calendar year from the start of the next school term, that employee shall maintain any rights accrued during previous service with the school district.

HB 6299 passed the General Assembly and was vetoed by the Governor. HB 6299 will be returned to the House of Representatives for action in the November Veto Session

*A Yes vote is considered a right vote. A No, Present, or not voting is considered a wrong vote.*

**SB 317 – Save the Illinois State Museum System**

SB 317 requires the State of Illinois to operate and keep open to the public the Illinois State Museum in Springfield along with the branch sites at Dickson Mounds, Lockport, Rend Lake, and the James R. Thompson Center. This legislation also requires that the Illinois State Museum operate a Research and Collections Center to research, preserve, and maintain access to the extensive Illinois State Museum collection.

SB 317 passed the General Assembly and awaits action by the Governor.

*A Yes vote is considered a right vote. A No, Present, or not voting is considered a wrong vote.*
