## AFSCME Retirees Subchapter 161 December 2019 Members' Meeting

Mary said, "The FAIR tax is a primary issue of the Jane Addams Senior Caucus."

Jesse asked, "Diane, will you be able to research about the FAIR tax?"

Diane said, "Ralph Martire will know other groups and what they are doing."

Mary said, "Attend meetings of the Chicago Metro Retirees to learn Robert's Rules of Order. I'll be attending the next meeting with Nancy. It's the fourth Monday of the month at Cermak and Halsted."

Ron said, "There has been a discussion on whether we should have separate tables or have tables in a square. There are advantages to both ways. Do we want it alternating?"

Marlene said, "Half the people aren't here today. Can we table the discussion to the next meeting?"

John said, "We should discuss how we want to do it at the next meeting."

Dave said, "I suggest next month we do it in the round."

Mary said, "Some people can't hear what is said when it's in the round."

Pat said, "There's a motion to alternate; I second it."

Ron said, "I second the motion to table the discussion 'til next month."

Dave said, "I think we should alternate, but next time have it in the round."
